Goldsboro, North Carolina





ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Peter Berg '70

When asked what he learned as a member of Pi Kappa Phi, Peter Berg '70, said, "The two most important things were to not judge people by their initial look, and the importance of socialization, to have a group of friends. And, as we age, we need to continue being social. I started a morning walking group 12 years ago and we often have 10 or more people walking the 2.5 miles around our town's waterfront park."

With two children, Pat and Lisa, and three granddaughters, Berg is retired and lives in Cos Cob, Connecticut. He spends, "long hours every day on town government, local politics, the library and several other local organizations."

Now serving his 10th term on his town's non-partisan Representative Town Meeting (one of 230 members, the 5th largest legislative body in the United States), he said, "I call it 'student council for grown-ups."



Berg and other Pi Kapps were heavily involved in campus politics in the late '60s. He said, "At Carolina, I was involved along with other Pi Kapps, including Bruce Jolly and my pledge classmate Raphael Perez Mancebo (student body vice-president), in political shenanigans; this was several years before the Watergate break-in."

Berg said he majored in math, "Until I joined Pi Kappa Phi, when I changed my major to Fraternity. I served as Rush Chairman for multiple semesters and then as IFC Rush Chairman. I am grateful to have been accepted as a Pi Kapp and have many fond memories of our brotherhood. I increasingly realize the importance of social involvement. I am grateful to David Ruffin, Kirk Preiss, Thomas Griffis, and Mike Collins for keeping my Pi Kapp cohort in touch. Lifelong friendships are rare, even with Facebook."

Ryan Ferraioli '12

As the newest member of Kappa Council's Executive Committee, Ryan Ferraioli ('12) brings a focused attitude to his role. "In situations



like the chapter, you're going to have episodic peaks and valleys. We're talking to the chapter about how to do things right so they can maximize the fun they have and do it right."

As a vice-president and leverage loan desk analyst with Regions Securities, a division of Regions Bank, Ferraioli "drifted back to Charlotte from Atlanta, where we had a great group of our guys. Found the same thing in Charlotte and reengaged with the guys here."

Ferraioli was part of Kappa Chapter's refounding group in 2009. He said, "One of the great things about being in a fraternity is that it gives you a chance to learn important lessons at an early age. He said, "Regions Bank is increasing our connection to UNC and other schools so I'm looking at our house as a resource. We already have one brother as an intern and will be looking at others in the future."

KAPPA COUNCIL REPORT

Fellow Pi Kapps,

As another year at UNC and Kappa Chapter concludes, I appreciate the opportunity to provide an update for you.

We initiated 18 new members at the conclusion of Fall semester, and 14 new members in the Spring. Now having graduated 24 members, our net chapter size returning in August is 69.

Elsewhere in 216, you will see details about several accomplished alumni and students.

In our last newsletter, we summarized some of our challenges. Notably, the chapter has swung from a very large Account Receivable of \$150,000 to ending the year with but \$500 in unaccounted Receivables, a testament to young men who listened and learned.

We have half-way completed our two-semester social probation (from Member Education infractions), and our students are substituting philanthropic activities for social and alcohol interests.

Our Kappa Council Board of Directors has welcomed Ryan Ferraioli '12, a member of our re-founding efforts in 2010. As a past Chapter Treasurer and now an investment banker with Regions Bank, Ryan brings strong convictions, relatability with our young students, and significant financial acumen to our board.

We also wish to thank Marty Lindsey '84, who steps down from our board after serving for the past 13 years. Having had two sons graduate from UNC as members of other fraternities, Marty has brought great perspectives from outside experience and has patiently always been "down the street" as a resident of Chapel Hill.

The Board will continue improvements to the chapter house this summer, including gutter repairs, some exterior door replacements, and complete repair and painting of the house trim. The third-party property management firm we have engaged is improving our approach to student move-in/ move-out and helping to drive the



necessary maintenance and improvements to the house.

More significantly, the Board has improved our communication with parents, and the students held a Graduation event with parents at the end of the semester. We also plan informal alumni gatherings in key cities (Raleigh, Charlotte, Greensboro), and a group of 30+ alumni convene again in June in Pinehurst for a weekend of golf and fellowship (The Freeman Classic, in honor of a lost Brother), as they have for 42 consecutive years. We hope all efforts such as these will continue to integrate parents and alumni into our life-long Kappa experience.
