
House Improvements

Bob White '69

Bob White would have had a hard time seeing himself as the chapter advisor at a fraternity when he headed south. He said, "I grew up in Connecticut, was looking for a good business school, and wanted to go south; that's how I ended up at Carolina. I knew no one down here. In fact, I only had one date my first semester. Bob Richards, a guy in my dorm, got me into Pi Kappa Phi."

After graduation, White spent a couple of years in the Navy as an officer on an oiler and then it was back to North Carolina. He said, "By 1971, I was back in the area working for Ernst and Young. I served as the chapter advisor for a couple of years when the fraternity was on Finley Road."

White started a CPA firm in 1972 and within a decade he had started Raleigh Securities, Inc., specializing in investment portfolio management. He has served as president of the company for over 41 years.



He said, "I know it sounds like a cliché, but the fraternity was a wonderful environment in which to grow up. I look at the lifelong friends I have whom I'd never have met if I'd just lived in the dorm or an apartment. Pi Kappa Phi has been such a force in who I am."

Mike Stout '84

In the summer of 2018, Mike Stout was 56 years young and the oldest bicyclist to ever ride in, and complete, Pi Kappa Phi Fraternity's 3,000-mile Journey of Hope. The JOH is the fraternity's non-profit organization and event that raises awareness for kids and young adults with disabilities. Stout rode from San Francisco to Washington, DC.

After spending over 20 years owning and operating two of Chapel Hill's most popular bars/restaurants, Bub O'Malley's and Michael's, Stout took on the challenging role of house father and executive chef when PKP was refounded at 216 East Rosemary. He was an outstanding leader (2009–2020).

Stout said, "One of the amazing things about the refounding group was the diversity of interests and intelligence. We had some of the smartest guys I've ever met and they were wonderfully creative. And no, let's don't talk about them trucking several tons of sand into the new house for a beach party (LOL!!)!

Cody Poplin '12

Cody Poplin described backpacking in the Himalayas in 2012–2013 as a "great experience!" But, considering his academic and professional journey since then, the Himalayas may have seemed understated.

Poplin graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Carolina with highest distinction with degrees in Political Science and Peace, War, and Defense. He was awarded the Russell S. Cowell, Jr. prize for achieving the most distinguished academic record in his department and is a member of the Order of the Golden Fleece. After Carolina, Cody completed a Luce Fellowship in India and a Scoville Fellowship in Washington, DC, and worked as an analyst at the Brookings Institution and managing editor of *Lawfare*.

Cody is a graduate of Yale Law School ('19), where he was an executive editor of the Yale Law Journal and a teaching fellow in constitutional law. He is now an associate in the Washington, DC office of Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher, practicing in the Litigation Department in national security related issues.

He said, "Pi Kapp was a unique experience. Before and during my time as Archon (2011–2012), I learned so much about leadership; about how to rally people to a cause. The practical aspects of how to get people to buy into an idea have helped me in my work today. But, the most important thing has been the friendships. It can be difficult to make close friends after 30 and I have stayed wonderfully in touch with the brothers I made in Pi Kappa Phi."

KAPPA COUNCIL REPORT

Stuart Hicks '78

President, Kappa Council

Fellow Pi Kapps and Parents,

Kappa Chapter is performing well scholastically and continues to rank #2 on campus amongst all fraternities.

The recent rush and member education efforts produced 18 new initiates, bringing our chapter size to 89 men.

Elsewhere in 216, you will see details about a terrific group of accomplished students.

Three semesters ago, we communicated several behavioral stumbles the Chapter experienced, and we are pleased to report that the students accepted their one-year suspension by the University and National Fraternity, which required zero organized socials and alcohol in the house. During this 12-month suspension, they benefited from some key learnings and strengthened self-governance, and will complete this process in December.

Other progress:

- House Occupancy is up to 76%, with leases out for signature to achieve 100% in 2024-25.
- Account Receivables are much lower (not yet zero) but our students are learning the importance of steady vigilance and direct communication about personal accountability.
 - Rent prepayments were very high for 2023–24, and Dues prepayments were much improved.

We welcomed two new Kappa Council Directors, including members from our refounding class over a decade ago:

- Ryan Ferraioli '12, an investment banker in Charlotte, and a Chapter Treasurer as an undergraduate.
- Tyler Aiken '11, a wealth manager in Asheville, and a Vice Archon as an undergraduate.

The Board has continued to modernize Kappa Council operations. Most significantly, we have:

• Increased communication frequency and transparency with parents and alumni to better integrate them into the Kappa experience. Responses from both parents and alumni support this more active relationship.

Commenced our one-on-one mentoring process between students and alumni, with 12 such relationships now underway. This includes self-defined cadences for 1:1 discussion about fraternity experience, studies, careers, internships, and post-graduate employment. Please reach out to us should you be interested



in contributing in this high-value-low-time commitment way!

- Operationalized our professional third-party property management service (Alpha Fraternity Management), which greatly aided efforts to upgrade the chapter house. A multi-year asset management plan, including defined and routine preventative maintenance efforts, is underway. (See partial list of improvements in this issue.)
- Benefited from a tremendous gift of new tables and chairs for our Chapter/Study Room and Dining Room, generated through the relocation of the headquarters of our Charlotte-based Pi Kappa Phi National Fraternity. We are MOST grateful to the National Fraternity's guidance, support, and generosity!

We will hold another formal KC Annual Meeting (in-person and virtual) on February 17, 2024 at 10:00 am with transparent reporting about chapter and KC operations and treasury. More information to follow.

The experience of Pi Kappa Phi builds life-long friendships and offers continued learning opportunities for both our undergraduates and alumni. We are committed to stand together as we continue our journey of almost 110 years at UNC-Chapel Hill! We have confidence in the young men and new executive officers with whom we are building Kappa's future and invite your inquiries about how to become engaged in the process!
